Philosophy of Education Essay Competition for Graduate Students

The Center for Ethics and Education is pleased to announce an essay competition for graduate students. We are looking for essays that use philosophical insight and argument to address an important issue in educational policy and/or practice. The problem the essay addresses might arise in early childhood education, compulsory education, or post-secondary education, or in the way children are raised in families.

Awards

1st prize winner = \$3000 + invitation to participate as discussant in one of the Center's regular workshop-style conferences (includes airfare, accommodation, food).

2nd prize winner = \$2000

3rd prize winner = \$1000

Eligibility

- Essay must not exceed 6500 words (excluding references).
- Must not already be published or committed to publication.
- Must be written in English.
- May be co-authored, though both authors must be graduate students.

The authors or co-authors must be enrolled in a graduate degree program in an accredited college or university, but must not yet have defended their PhD by December 1st, 2017.
