Peacebuilders possess the critical "c"eeds necessary to tackle our communities' most challenging issues. Come ready to learn and be inspired to bring peace into your home, school, workplace, practice, or any environment in which you interact with children and youth.

Takeaways: Participants will leave the workshop series with *Peace Action Plans* for their homes, schools, classrooms, or programs. Morning sessions will offer interactive panel discussions with national and local leaders in peacebuilding. Afternoon sessions will allow participants to work in small groups to create their Action Plans. These plans may include: *Civic Action Plans, Family / 'Ohana Plans, Safe School Plans, Family-School Partnership Plans, or Integrated Curriculum Plans, among others.*
